Many CUPE members don't make a living wage

Many of our CUPE members earn **below the provincial living wage of \$24.62**. In some cases, that amount is as low as **\$19.44**. This is **not a living wage**, and it is **not enough to afford a two-bedroom rental** in markets like Dieppe and Fredericton, let alone a one-bedroom in Moncton and Riverview. Because of this, obtaining the \$70,000 needed for the dream of homeownership is just not in the cards for a number of our members.

The cost of rent and other necessities like food and gas **increases are the same for everyone**. Shouldn't CUPE workers be given a fair chance at **a living wage and a better future**?
